Proclamation of Scripture

First Reading Isaiah 52:13—53:12

(Sylvia Thomas)

Reader: A reading from the Book of Isaiah

See, my servant shall prosper; he shall be exalted and lifted up and shall be very high. Just as there were many who were astonished at him - so marred was his appearance, beyond human semblance, and his form beyond that of mortals - so he shall startle many nations; kings shall shut their mouths because of him; for that which had not been told them they shall see, and that which they had not heard they shall contemplate. Who has believed what we have heard? And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed? For he grew up before him like a

young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; he had no form or majesty that we should look at him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. He was despised and rejected by others; a man of suffering and acquainted with infirmity; and as one from whom others hide their faces he was despised, and we held him of no account. Surely, he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. By a perversion of justice, he was taken away. Who could have imagined his future? For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people. They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb with the rich, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth. Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him with pain. When you make his life an offering for sin, he shall see his offspring, and shall prolong his days; through him the will of the Lord shall prosper. Out of his anguish he shall see light; he shall find satisfaction through his knowledge. The righteous one, my servant, shall make many righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities. Therefore, I will allot him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he poured out himself to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many and made intercession for the transgressors.

Psalm 22 (Irene Thomas)

My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? and are so far from my cry and from the words of my distress?

O my God, I cry in the daytime, but you do not answer;

by night as well, but I find no rest.

Yet you are the Holy One, enthroned upon the praises of Israel.

Our forefathers put their trust in you; they trusted, and you delivered them.

Narrator 2: The Passion of our Lord, Jesus Christ according to John.

Narrator 1: After Jesus had spoken these words, he went out with his disciples across the Kidron valley to a place where there was a garden, which he and his disciples entered. Now Judas, who betrayed him, also knew the place, because Jesus often met there with his disciples. So, Judas brought a detachment of soldiers together with police from the chief priests and the Pharisees, and they came there with lanterns and torches and weapons.

Jesus: For whom are you looking?

Soldier: Jesus of Nazareth.

Jesus: I am he.

Narrator 1: The soldiers, police, and Judas stepped back and fell to the ground.

Jesus: For whom are you looking?

Police: Jesus of Nazareth.

Jesus: I told you that I am he. So, if you are looking for me, let these men go. **Narrator 1**: Then Simon Peter, who had a sword, drew it, struck the high priest's slave, and cut off his right ear.

Jesus: Put your sword back into its sheath. Am I not to drink the cup that the Father has given me?

Narrator 1: So, the soldiers, their officer, and the Jewish police arrested Jesus and bound him. First, they took him to Annas, who was the father-in-law of Caiaphas,

the high priest that year. Caiaphas was the one who had advised the Jews that it was better to have one person die for the people.

Narrator 2: Simon Peter and another disciple followed Jesus. Since that disciple was known to the high priest, he went with Jesus into the courtyard of the high priest, but Peter was standing outside at the gate. So, the other disciple, who was known to the high priest, went out, spoke to the woman who guarded the gate, and brought Peter in.

Woman: You are not also one of this man's disciples, are you?

Peter: I am not.

Narrator 2: Now the slaves and the police had made a charcoal fire because it was cold, and they were standing round it and warming themselves. Peter also was standing with them and warming himself. Then the high priest questioned Jesus about his disciples and about his teaching.

Jesus: I have spoken openly to the world; I have always taught in synagogues and in the temple, where all the Jews come together. I have said nothing in secret. Why do you ask me? Ask those who heard what I said to them; they know what I said.

Narrator 1: One of the police standing nearby struck Jesus on the face.

Police: Is that how you answer the high priest?

Jesus: If I have spoken wrongly, testify to the wrong. But if I have spoken rightly, why do you strike me?

Narrator 2: Then Annas sent him bound to Caiaphas the high priest. (PAUSE because scene changes) Simon Peter was standing and warming himself at the fire with the slaves and police.

Police: You are not also one of his disciples, are you?

Peter: I am not.

Slave: Did I not see you in the garden with him? You are the one who cut off my

cousin's ear.

Peter: I am not.

Police: Listen – the cock is crowing. Morning has come.

Narrator 1: Then they took Jesus from Caiaphas to Pilate's headquarters. It was early in the morning. The Jews did not enter the headquarters, so as to avoid ritual defilement and to be able to eat the Passover. So, Pilate went out to them.

Pilate: What accusation do you bring against this man?

Congregation: If this man were not a criminal, we would not have handed him over to you.

Pilate: Take him yourselves and judge him according to your law.

Congregation: We are not permitted to put anyone to death.

Pilate: Bring me this Jesus.

Pilate: Are you the King of the Jews?

Jesus: Do you ask this on your own, or did others tell you about me?

Pilate: I am not a Jew, am I? Your own nation and the chief priests have handed

you over to me. What have you done?

Jesus: My kingdom is not from this world. If my kingdom were from this world, my followers would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews.

But as it is, my kingdom is not from here.'

Pilate: So, you are a king?

Jesus: You say that I am a king. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice.

Pilate: What is truth?

Pilate: I find no case against him. But you have a custom that I release someone for you at the Passover. Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?

Congregation: Not this man, but the bandit Barabbas!

Pilate: Then take this man and flog him.

Narrator 1: And the soldiers wove a crown of thorns and put it on his head, and they dressed him in a purple robe and struck him on the face.

Soldiers: Hail, King of the Jews!'

Pilate: Look, I bring him out to you one more time to let you know that I find no case against him. Here is the man!

Congregation: Crucify him! Crucify him!

Pilate: Take him yourselves and crucify him; I find no case against him.

Congregation: According to our law he ought to die because he has claimed to be the Son of God.

Pilate: I am filled with great fear. I must be careful.

Pilate: Jesus, where are you from?

Jesus: (silence)

Pilate: Do you refuse to speak to me? Do you not know that I have power to release you, and power to crucify you?

Jesus: You would have no power over me unless it had been given you from above; therefore, the one who handed me over to you is guilty of a greater sin.

Pilate: I must release this man, for he has done nothing wrong.

Congregation: If you release this man, you are no friend of the emperor.

Everyone who claims to be a king sets himself against the emperor.

Pilate: So be it. Here is your King!

Congregation: Away with him! Away with him! Crucify him!

Pilate: Shall I crucify your King?

Congregation: We have no king but the emperor.

Pilate: So be it.

Narrator 1: So, they took Jesus; and carrying the cross by himself, he went out to what is called The Place of the Skull, (**PLEASE STAND!**), which in Hebrew is called Golgotha. There they crucified him, and with him two others, one on either side, with Jesus between them. Pilate also had an inscription written and put on the cross. It read, 'Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews.' Many of the Jews read this inscription, because the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city; and it was written in Hebrew, in Latin, and in Greek. The chief priests asked that it be changed to 'This man said, I am King of the Jews,' but Pilate refused. When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his clothes and divided them.

Narrator 2: Meanwhile, standing near the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her.

Jesus: Woman, here is your son, and my friend, here is your mother.

Narrator 1: And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.

(Pause)

Jesus: I am thirsty.

Narrator: 2 A jar full of sour wine was standing there. So, they put a sponge full of the wine on a branch of hyssop and held it to his mouth. He received the wine and drank it. (pause) Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

Jesus: It is finished.

Narrator 1: Since it was the day of Preparation, the Jews did not want the bodies left on the cross during the sabbath, especially because that sabbath was a day of great solemnity. So, they asked Pilate to have the legs of the crucified men broken and the bodies removed. Then the soldiers came and broke the legs of the first and of the other who had been crucified with him. But when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. Instead, one of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and at once blood and water came out.

Narrator 2: He who saw this has testified so that you also may believe. His testimony is true, and he knows that he tells the truth. These things occurred so that the scripture might be fulfilled, "None of his bones shall be broken." And again, another passage of scripture says, "They will look on the one whom they have pierced."

Narrator 1: After these things, Joseph of Arimathea, who was a disciple of Jesus, though a secret one because of his fear of the Jews, asked Pilate to let him take away the body of Jesus. Pilate gave him permission; so, he came and removed his body. Nicodemus, who had at first come to Jesus by night, also came, bringing a mixture of myrrh and aloes, weighing about a hundred pounds. They took the body of Jesus and wrapped it with the spices in linen cloths, according to the burial custom of the Jews.

Narrator 2: Now there was a garden in the place where he was crucified, and in the garden, there was a new tomb in which no one had ever been laid. And so, because it was the Jewish day of Preparation, and the tomb was nearby, they laid Jesus there.

The Solemn Intercession

Celebrant: I went before you in a pillar of cloud, and you have led me to the judgement hall of Pilate. I scourged your enemies and brought you to a land of freedom, but you have scourged, mocked, and beaten me. I gave you the water of salvation from the rock, but you have given me gall and left me to thirst.

All: Holy God, holy and mighty, holy, and immortal one, have mercy upon us.

Celebrant: I gave you a royal sceptre, and bestowed the keys to the kingdom, but you have given me a crown of thorns. I raised you on high with great power, but you have hanged me on the cross.

All: Holy God, holy and mighty, holy, and immortal one, have mercy upon us.

Celebrant: My peace I gave, which the world cannot give, and washed your feet as a sign of my love, but you draw the sword to strike in my name and seek high places in my kingdom. I offered you my body and blood, but you scatter and deny and abandon me.

Celebrant: I sent the Spirit of truth to guide you, and you close your hearts to the Counsellor. I pray that all may be as one in the Father and me, but you continue to quarrel and divide. I call you to go and bring forth fruit, but you cast lots for my clothing.

Celebrant: I grafted you into the tree of my chosen Israel, and you turned on them with persecution and mass murder. I made you joint heirs with them of my covenants, but you made them scapegoats for your own guilt.
